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





The gallery showcases works by artists from Africa and its diaspora and mainly aims to provide their works with international visibility through exhibitions, art fairs, and collaborations with cultural institutions.

The gallery aims to be a place for exchange and dialogue, engaging in conversations with the public. AFIKARIS gives voices to its artists on topical issues, as well as subjects at the heart of their art. It is also a space for reflection about the African contemporary art scene. 

THIS IS NOT A WHITE CUBE is an international contemporary art gallery with exhibition spaces in Luanda, Angola and Lisbon, Portugal. Representing and collaborating with international established and emerging artists, the gallery's programme focuses on relevant and powerful narratives associated with the African continent and its diaspora. It

is the first contemporary African gallery in Portugal that focuses not exclusively on Lusophone circles, but also the emerging aesthetics of cultural and artistic productions from Angola, Democratic Republic of Congo, Mozambique, South Africa, Brazil, and São Tomé and Príncipe. The gallery maintains a regular and significant presence in important international art fairs.

LouiSimone Guirandou Gallery represents emerging and established artists from Africa. Founded in 2015 by Simone Guirandou-N'Diaye and her daughter Gazelle, the gallery follows suit to Arts Pluriels, one of the first art galleries in Abidjan, Côte d'Ivoire. Through a programme of solo and group exhibitions, as well as participation in international art fairs, LouiSimone Guirandou Gallery provides a platform for artists and audiences from Côte d'Ivoire and abroad.

As an art historian and well-known contributor to the arts in Côte d'Ivoire, Simone Guirandou-N'Diaye curated the first International Exhibition of Plastic Arts of Abidjan (SIAPA) and is a member of both the Academy of Sciences, Arts, Cultures of Africa and African Diasporas (ASCAD) and the International Association of Art Critics (AICA).

Founded in 2020 by Jennifer Houdrouge, the gallery's modernist building from 1953 is an iconic example of Dakar's architectural history. In Wolof, 'selebe yoon' means 'the crossroad,' the place where different paths intersect. As a site of convergence for interdisciplinary research and practices, Selebe Yoon is supportive of artists' creative processes and artistic experimentations, and encourages dialogues amongst artists and cultural actors.

Galerie Véronique Rieffel (Côte d'Ivoire)

Dedicated to contemporary art and design, Galerie Véronique Rieffel presents works by artists from the Middle East and the African continent, as well as artists who have built strong relationships with these regions of the world. To contribute to the new dynamics and organisation of these cultural landscapes, the gallery aims to heighten the awareness around these artists and their cultural backgrounds.

Based in Côte d'Ivoire, but nomadic at heart, Galerie Véronique Rieffel opened its new permanent space near the historic town of Grand-Bassam, in the atypical setting of the Mondoukou coconut grove. This vast multidisciplinary artists complex, called the 'Cocoteraie des arts,' hosts various disciplines and offers a unique artistic experience far from cultural consumption. It also acts as a residency space which allows artists to create in a particularly inspirational and stimulating environment.
