in □ Save Soheila Sokhanvari's disco-ball homage to actresses and chanteuses in prerevolutionary Iran, *Rebel Rebel* at the Barbican (to February 26), was
heartbreakingly timely, launching as protests for women's rights following
Mahsa Amini's death surged across the country. Veronica Ryan, 66, who in
Hackney last year created the first public memorial to the Windrush generation
— cast sculptures of breadfruit, custard apple and soursop, carrying memories
of her native Montserrat — won 2022's <u>Turner Prize</u>. The Hayward's
glamorous *In the Black Fantastic*, showing how African diaspora artists in the
US and Britain use myth and magical realism to address racism, was a
revelation.
