This is an exciting week in the art world! Lots of new exhibitions are opening up, but only for a short while. Make sure you visit them as soon as you can! Here are 5 you must absolutely visit this week:

1. THE PECKHAM PELICAN

Artist Kim Yahya explores the possibility of paint as a medium in a series of abstract, but highly expressive, images.

2. ROUNDHOUSE

A multisensorial experience that mixes art, theatre, and music, Utopia takes inspiration from Thomas More's 16th century book to explore ever-important themes such as inequality, consumerism, housing, and education.

TOP TIP: on Tuesdays, you pay what you like; on Wednesdays and Thursdays, you can attend Live Lates, a series of events and performances featuring the likes of Paul Evans, Tommy Frozen, and Akala.

3. Vivian Maier

4. CELINA TEAGUE: I THINK THEREFORE I

In her new series of paintings, Teague explores the role the hashtag has in social media, and its power to alert us about the main atrocities committed all over the world.

TOP TIP: are you using social media consciously? Debate the question with your friends while viewing the exhibition.

5. THOMAS RUFF: NATURE MORTE

Ruff digitally transformed sepia-toned albumen prints into dramatically contrasting apparitions to remind us of the important role a film negative had before the digital revolution.
