Tabish's Top 5 Art Exhibitions to see in London this week

Tabish Khan brings you five art exhibitions in London that you should visit during the week. Each one comes with a concise review to help you decide whether it's for you.



1. Richard Stone: Gleam @ Kristin Hjellegjerde

Romantic heroism in sculpture and painting from an emerging artist. The sculpture is the strong point of the show and is classically inspired yet clearly contemporary. A great mixture of style and excellent to see a modern sculptor creating works in marble.



2. David Levene: Eyewitness @ The Gallery at Foyles, 107 Charing Cross Road

Guardian photographer David Levene picks his favourite shots from the newspaper's Eyewitness series including the rather bizarre plane on top of a petrol station and old men playing chess whilst in a swimming pool.



Juliette Losg: Nemora @ Fine Art Society

Traditional landscape painting takes a turn around the wall and rolls across the floor in this creative take on an established subject matter.



National Open Art @ Somerset House

A solid collection of emerging talent in representational art, including the abandoned photographs of Gina Soden and Chrissy Eastwood, and the mind blowing aerial shots by Marcus Lyons.



Innovative use of materials includes a noose encrusted with dead sea salt and footprints on sand across the walls, in this political art exhibition from a middle eastern artist.
