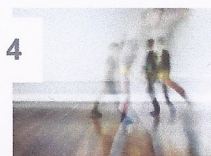
Surrounded by Idiots: The ID Crew show

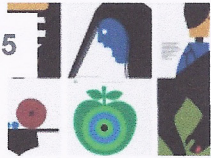

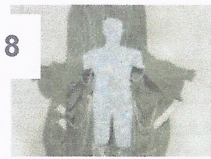

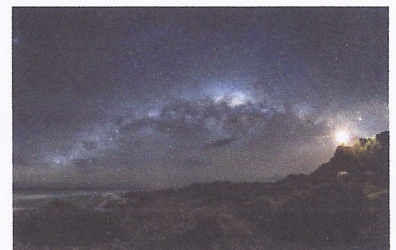
